UTILITY MANAGER REPORT

UTILITY MANAGER REPORT

In Utility General Manager Ankrum absence, Chairman McElfresh reported on other matters as follows:

- Safety: IMPA/TVPPA Safety training will occur this Wednesday, June 12^{th,} and cover Bucket/Pole Top rescue.
- HR: TMU has General Labor positions open in both Water and Collections departments. The positions have been posted with limited interest thus far.
- Cybersecurity: Ankrum, McElfresh and Mayor Schmicker met last week with Insurance provider Walker-Hughes. McElfresh provided the Board with an update.
- IMPA: Construction of the IMPA Solar Field continues in anticipation of start-up and commissioning ifnQ1 of 2025.
- Electrical: TMU Electrical will next week be assisting Contractors at Tipton High School for some electrical gear tie-ins. Transformers have been set and a tie-in outage will occur starting June 10th.
- Water: Peerless Midwest completed East and West plant annual well flow testing.
 The results are within acceptable operating ranges. As per last year's approved well
 reconditioning plan, Peerless will pull and recondition one (1) well this year. The
 well selected is well #6 within the City system as it has been 12 years since that
 well was last reconditioned.
- Sanitary Sewer Force Main Connector and Elevated Water Projects:
 - Sanitary Force Main project:
 - F&K and HDD Subcontractor Daystar, continue to install pipe along Old SR 28 between CR 500W and CR 400W. 6,000 If of pipe has been installed. Work will continue along the south side of Old SR 28 for the next two months.
 - Water Tower project status:
 - Foundation work on site is anticipated to occur in July with Tower construction this Fall and Painting next Spring.
 - O GM Ankrum spoke to Tipton County Council on May 21st to encourage the transfer of their final \$500K commitment to the READI collective fund in the City Clerk-Treasurer's office. County Council unanimously voted to approve advertisement for Public Hearing and appropriation at their June 18th meeting.
- US 31/SR 28 Development
 - SE Quadrant, owned by Tipton Land Development: No new news.

- Stellantis Factory for Sale: A prospective Buyer has had discussion with City and County leaders to potentially purchase the facility. TMU continues to provide Utility info and input.
- City East Side Development Studies by Strand
 - Ankrum is awaiting quotes to accurately gage the overall cost of the project (likely less than \$100k) and report back to the Board. The Delong property
 - (formerly Tuff Muff) has officially annexed into the City and TMU awaits further discussion on future Utility needs, if any, and timing.
 - Ankrum has shared the Strand study on the sanitary sewer options in this area. More discussion needs to be had to determine a path forward as this will likely be a much more expensive project.
- The next TUSB meeting will be Monday, June 17,2024 starting at 4:30 pm in Council Chambers.
